Storms which swept over the western part of Ontario Sunday, bringing an end to the week-old heat wave, left the Border Cities unscathed, though causing damage in some other localities. Except for brief interruptions in Hydro service, the effect of the storm here was entirely beneficial.

GALE AT GODERICH

The really damaging wind was from the west, and it was a severe one. It came with the local rain, and it was not until about 11 o'clock that the gale died away. It swept through the London country, and along the shore of the western part of the lake, down several times and scattered up to the Goderich region. It was here that it did the most damage. The houses were blown down, and the telegraph lines were snapped. The gale was accompanied by a heavy rain, and the storm was the worst since the winter of 1919.
